The Galathon 2022 was a success! It was also a wonderful tribute to Jerry Wayne, on the anniversary of his passing. A lot has happened since the 2021 Gala. We were able to hire Jeff Rubin as our new Executive Director. Although he's been on-board just since September 2021, Jeff has done much to help Valley Jewish Community Center re-enter the Community in a meaningful and impressive way.

Jeff has already secured a large grant for the purpose of providing far enhanced security for our first-rate preschool, Today's Montessori. Community Engagement Award Los Angeles Controller Ron Galperin



Ron Galperin is the 19th Controller of the City of Los Angeles, elected in 2013 and again in 2017. He serves as the watchdog for taxpayers at City Hall, making sure public dollars are spent efficiently and effectively. He is also the paymaster, auditor and chief accounting officer for the City of Los Angeles. Galperin oversees a team that conducts independent audits, manages the City's payroll and spending, reports on the City's finances, pursues fraud and waste, and works to create a more transparent, accountable and modern city for residents.

Galperin launched ControlPanel LA, the City's first open data portal, in 2013. It features details on the goods and services Los Angeles buys, along with information on assets and liabilities, employee compensation, operating indicators and much more. Because of his efforts, L.A. has been named the "No. 1 Digital City" by the U.S. City Open Data Census three years in a row. Government Technology Magazine put Controller Galperin on its list of the "Top 25 Doers, Dreamers and Drivers." In 2019, Galperin received the Tyler Public Sector Excellence Award.

Prior to his election, Galperin built a reputation outside City Hall as a leading voice for government reform. He is the first Neighborhood Council member elected to citywide office in Los Angeles. During his Neighborhood Council tenure, Galperin was known as an advocate for quality of life improvements and responsible neighborhood planning. He also developed and taught "L.A. City Government 101" to community activists throughout the city, and served as a budget advocate.

Galperin has long promoted cutting government waste and looked for ways to help businesses create jobs. As chair of the Los Angeles Commission on Revenue Efficiency, he worked to develop new revenue sources and budget savings to deliver more services to residents and businesses. He also presided over the City's Quality and Productivity Commission.

Galperin has more than 20 years of experience as an attorney and small business owner. He earned his law degree from Loyola Law School in Los Angeles after graduating from Washington University in St. Louis. He lives in West Los Angeles with his husband, Rabbi Zachary Shapiro and his twin daughters.

Community Partner Award The Village at NorthRidge, Bradlee Foerschner, Executive Director



Bradlee Foerschner is an Executive Director who specializes in senior living and is currently the acting Executive Director at The Village at NorthRidge, a Senior Resource Group community since January of 2020. Bradlee's passion for the senior living space stems from her early years acting as the primary caregiver for her grandmother, Marybelle. Throughout the years her career evolved, leading to roles including Memory Care Director, Director of Operations, Assistant Administrator and eventually Executive Director. In addition to being a state licensed Executive Director, Bradlee was also one of the first



In addition to her certifications, she was also named as the 2021 California Assisted Living Association (CALA) Outstanding Executive Director of the Year. 


